

Manager's Message

Hello once again, before I start I would like to send out my condolences to the Glass family for the recent loss of a loved one, the loss will forever be felt within the Mountains as he was a sincere gentleman who brought a smile to anyone who he ever came in contact with. While speaking of the loss of a valued and much loved community man, I would like to call on community members to meet here at ACRC or somewhere neutral if that is what the community would like, to discuss how we go forward as community. I would like for us to discuss on how we ACRC or as individual community members can notify other community members of the loss of a community member. For at the moment we here are at a cross road when it comes to letting community know of a loss in the community. I say this as the recent loss here in the Blue Mountains I was asked by the family not to place a notice on Facebook or to call around as the family wanted some time to themselves. On other occasions we have been questioned as to why we (ACRC) or other people placing the name of one that has recently passed when culturally we are not allowed to speak that person's name for a year. So I am asking for community to come together and help me and the rest of the team here at ACRC on how culturally in this contemporary world of the more appropriate ways on communicating the loss of a community member without disrespecting a family's request and without disrespecting or upsetting other community member's. I know this has been a tough and divided subject here in the Blue Mountains and many other Aboriginal communities across Australia.

So please if you have views on how we can move forward as a community and you would like to share these views please feel welcome to come and meet with other community members so we can be better informed of the community views while having respected the families' loss and we have acknowledged the communities wish to be notified of the loss through a respectful way first and foremost for the grieving family and for the community as a whole. I am envisaging that from the meeting we will then be able to send out information to the community in the next blackmail of the proposals and ideas that have come out of the meetings and through valued feedback from the community. We will then install a standard procedure in notifying the community of the loss of a valued community member while once again firstly respecting the family's wishes on how they would like or not like ACRC to notify community members.



Blackmail

If you are receiving 'Blackmail' by post, please consider switching to receiving the 'Blackmail' via email. Each year the 'Blackmail' costs ACRC almost \$6500, as each 'Blackmail' post you receive costs around \$3. One dollar for postage, one dollar for printing and a bit more than a dollar for labour, paper, envelopes and labels etc. Over a year that amounts to \$33 per person signed up to the Blackmail through postage.

The postal system is not as fast as it used to be, it can take up to a week from us posting, to you receiving the 'Blackmail'. The email version you will get the information the day it is ready and it is always accessible, so you can't lose it and you can get another copy anytime.
