CONFIRMATION OF ABORIGINALITY

The ACRC Board will process the COA application at a Board meeting and will only approve confirmation for applicants who are Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander, either born or living in the Blue Mountains LGA, or descendants, or related to Blue Mountains Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander peoples. IT IS NOT AN AUTOMATIC CONFIRMATION.

You are responsible for providing the necessary documentation to meet the Confirmation of Aboriginality criteria, for example your birth certificate, adoption documents if appropriate and any other documentation to verify your Aboriginality. If there is insufficient documentation, your application will not be considered by the Board and will be returned to you for completion.

Please note that there's a minimum of 3 months waiting period for new COA Applications.

We wish our community a Safe and Happy holiday period. We look forward to welcoming you all into a fresh new year with exciting events.

A trip within a single zone = \$3.00

A trip crossing from one zone to another = \$6.00

A trip covering three zones = \$9.00

A trip covering all four zones = \$12.00




