IT'S MARCH 2024 ALREADY

Another year complete and we're full steam ahead into this one. We have already been taking our Elders' group on various outings. This prompts me to answer some questions FAQs that have been coming up while driving clients...

Q: How much will transport cost when going to ACRC events?

A: Transport provided for ACRC-run events are priced at the minimum charge. Meaning that the fee is a total of \$6 for each passenger.

Q: Can I make a quick stop on the way home from the event?

A: You must contact me at the office beforehand and request that I book in the additional trip for you. Providing it can be achieved without disrupting any other passengers getting home from the event, the trip will be added and the normal transport fee will be charged. Do not request extra trips from your driver when you are collected.

That last one also applies when there isn't an event. If you are being transported and you wish to add stops, call 02 4782 6569 as soon as possible to request the change. Please do not leave it to the last minute and ask your driver.

Community Programs - Family and Youth Hi Community,

At ACRC the Families and Youth program is off to a running start for 2024. Kicking off with Survival Day which was a massive hit and an amazing day to bring the community together and celebrate the Survival of our culture.

Koori Playgroup has recommenced for Term 1 at Bungarrabee Centre in Hazelbrook where we meet each Monday from 11am to 1pm. A Childcare education from MOCS support our playgroup.

Recently we have explored the option of changing the venue for our Koori Playgroup to make it more accessible for more local Indigenous Families to attend. We are hoping to enforce these changes started Term 2, so keep an eye on our social media for all updates.

This term we have partnered with Gateway Family Services to facilitate 'Circle of Security', a parenting program which helps parents develop secure relationships and stronger bonds with their children. We recently met with Ted Noffs Street University which has recently opened in Katoomba and have created a partnership with them to help support our Indigenous youth in the Blue Mountains.

We also have our Colour Fun Day coming up, this event is to show awareness for Mental Health and people effected by the 2022 Floods. This event is for all ages and our whole community, this event is Kindly provided by Wenworth Healthcare - NBMPHN. Our annual Family Fun Day is coming up in the April school holidays. We hold a partnered event with Belong and MOCS every April and October School holidays, we hope to see you all there! Our Family and Youth individual support has been at full capacity the whole of 2024 but we are thriving and supporting our clients where and when needed, thank you all for being patient and respectful to all our changes. Joining My Aged Care means you are entitled to discounts on things like meal services, fall prevention devices, personal care, domestic assistance and home modifications.

- Please let us know a week in advance if you have appointments or when attending Elders Activities and especially if you need transport.
- If anyone is experiencing cold and flu symptoms please wear a mask or reschedule appointments to be mindful of our staff members and drivers.
- Sometimes I'm out of the office and not here until after 10am, so please make appointments if you need any support with daily living, medical appointments or trying to work out the Aged Care system and supports.
